These classes build on basic embroidery stitches you might know, but layer them together to create a rich border stitch. We pulled out a classic game a few weekends ago: <u>Carcassone</u>. This one is a collaborative map that you build and score points for completing features like roads & cities. It's quick to learn and combines just the right amount of strategy with luck-of-the-draw in what tile you pick. We especially like the "Princess & the Dragon" expansion which sends a red dragon piece stomping across the board eating the other player's pieces (and sometimes your own). Our fictional dragon does a lot of drooling.

- PSA to Artists & Crafters: If you use Square to accept payments, there is a scam going around using a customer's *phone* to initiate a tap to pay payment which processes a fake cash payment. (It's not a problem with tap-to-pay credit cards) You can protect yourself by just turning off "tap to pay from iPhone" under Settings -> Account in your app.
