

- Brass Tubes: These rectangular brass tubes were so helpful in marking various spacings drawing our shoe patterns. <u>The set I have</u> was purchased for a different class but I use them so much!
- I love the waxed linen thread I get from Etsy shop WhiteCloverKiln.

 She sells 10 yard assortments so I can have lots of colors.
- This <u>leather punch by Bead Landing</u> looks bare bones in the packaging but it works like a dream. (Way better than the official leather punch we bought, in fact.) It's also great for felt.
